Current Issues

AUGSA

On May 5th I met with AUGSA. It was the first introduction to their new Executive. They were interested in becoming familiar with AUSU structure and services, which I was able to give information on. They were impressed with some of AUSU's initiatives.

GFC

There have been no meetings and no correspondence since my last report. The next meeting is scheduled for June 18, 2014.

GFC – ALEC & LSWG

There have been no meetings since my last report. The next meeting for the ALEC group is not scheduled until the fall. I volunteered to be on the working group to make recommendations based on the LSWG report. There has been several emails with reports and documentation that will be relevant to the work of this new group. I have not been informed of who will be on the group or how the group will be working yet.

GFC – SAC

Meeting on May 13th. Majority of the time was reviewing the financials for April 1, 2013 to March 21, 2014. There was a minimal amount of money left in the budget. It's my understanding that they moved some money from less popular awards to more popular awards in an effort to give out all available money. It was noted that there has been a decline in applications for travel bursaries. It was discussed whether this was due to a cut for this year in the amount available for each award. I believe they changed it from \$5000 to \$1000. It was also discussed that since travelling to practicums and conferences are very expensive and when the award was \$5000 it would cover all costs. Now that it is \$1000 and the student must come up with the rest of the costs themselves, they are unable to do this, and therefore do not need the bursary as they are opting not to go.
