

2022 Annual Student Survey Introduction

The AUSU Annual Student Survey provides a powerful opportunity for Athabasca University undergraduate students to voice their opinions and share valuable experiences. The anonymous feedback helps shape the priorities of the AUSU Executive Team and Student Council throughout the coming term.

The following 2022 Annual Survey Report is a guiding resource for student leaders at AUSU as they advocate on behalf of AU undergraduates. The 2022 Annual Student Survey circulated in the month of November and included 25 questions.

The data presented reflects the experiences of the 974 AU undergraduate students who completed the survey. The feedback echoes their satisfaction ratings, ranked priorities, and concerns about AU and AUSU. Topics include AU tuition costs, course content, tutors, as well as AUSU Student Council initiatives, advocacy priorities, and services.

As you review the data, it is helpful to keep in mind that the majority of survey respondents are:

- program students
- residing in Alberta
- in their 1st or 2nd year






Student respondents also ranked a list of 10 advocacy priorities in Q13 by level of importance to their AU student experience. You will find the top 3 priorities listed in the table below.



Q2: What faculty are you enrolled in?


























